

Phpmyadmin starting over.

If for any reason you need to make a fresh clean install of phpmyadmin. There are a few tips, you need to keep in my mind or starting over may prove difficult.

Start by checking the command apt-get autoremove. Also you can run apt-get autoclean.

If everything is zero, you are in the position to start over.

First open the synaptic package manager. Search the phpmyadmin. It should be colored as it is installed.

Right click on the small square and select complete removal. Not just removal. This is important.

The removal starts and it will ask you for deleting the already existing main database. If you want to keep the databases as they are, don't check it. If you want

to start over check it.

When the process is finished, right click on the small square and choose mark for installation, then apply.

The installation will start. After some time a window will open asking you if you want to configure with dbconfig-common.

Answer yes by checking the dbconfig-common prompt.

Then another window will open asking you to set a password for mysql. Enter the password of choice.

Another window will open for you to select the server of choice. If you are running Linux Mint or Ubuntu select Apache2, if anything else select both, to be sure.

Select by pressing space and confirm with enter.

Just keep on clicking next until the installation is finished.
